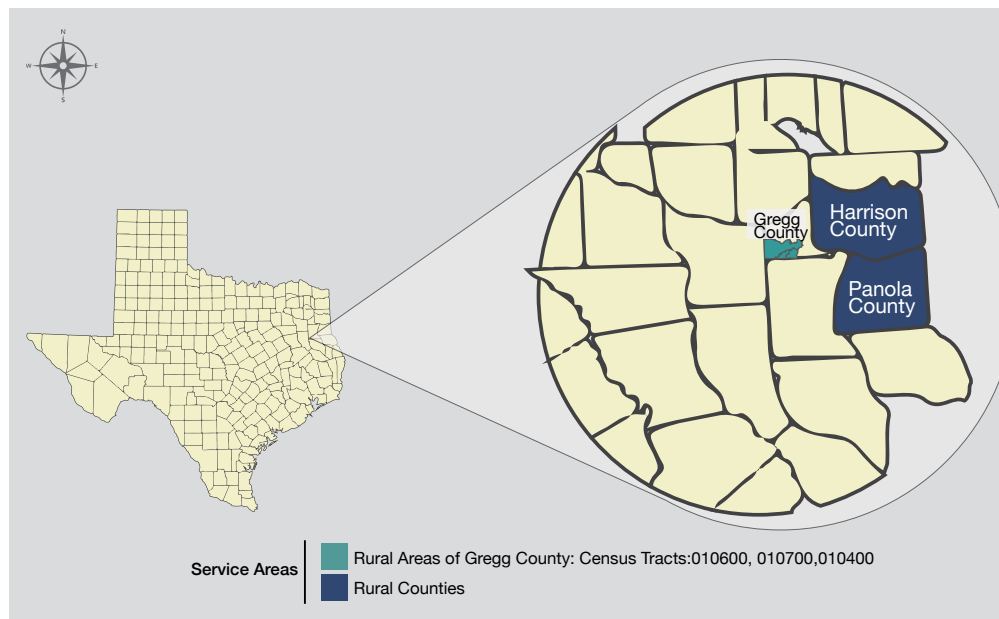
Project Vision/Mission

Austin State University (SFASU) School of Social Work to administer the Rural Communities Opioid Response Program-Planning (RCORP-Planning) Initiative. The purpose of the initiative is to strengthen and expand the capacity of rural communities to engage high risk populations and improve Substance Use Disorder/Opioid Use Disorder prevention, treatment, and recovery services through collaborative assessment and planning.

About the Project

THI and SFASU will engage in several core planning activities including: (1) conducting a community needs assessment and gap analysis; (2) developing a strategic plan and accompanying action plan; and (3) creating a community-led, multi-sector consortium to address Opioid Use Disorder and Methamphetamine Use Disorder in Panola County, Harrison County, and rural areas of Gregg County.
